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| MATHS | Learning Objective: <br> - - Subitise (recognise quantities without counting) up to 5 (ELG) <br> Brief Overview of the task: <br> Subitising - recognising an amount of dots or items on sight, without needing to count. <br> Find some small toys or items from around the house. Show groups of one, two or three of these items and see if your child can tell you how many there are without needing to count them. This may need some practise to begin with. <br> Next make some flashcards with either one, two or three dots on.
