Although near to the edge of the Fens, Downham has established and well supported rail links to London and Peterborough, via Ely, opening exciting opportunities to explore different cultures and environments quite easily.

Safeguarding is our top priority at Hillcrest.

The safeguarding of our pupils, families and staff forms the core of everything we do.

We believe in 3 core principles, each building on the one before:

- 1. Keeping everyone **SAFE**
- 2. Helping everyone to be **HAPPY** and **REGULATED**
- 3. Helping everyone to **LEARN** and **PROGRESS**

Hillcrest's Safeguarding Culture is central to all we do.

Our Designated Safeguarding Leads (DSLs) are deployed across the school site, ensuring that each of our buildings has a safeguarding expert on hand to help with any issues.

Three members of the Safeguarding Team are nonteaching, meaning that they can be there, at any time, when our children need them.

All staff receive yearly safeguarding training, based upon the most recent Keeping Children Safe in Education document and the Prevent initiative, in the form of the Norfolk Core Package (provided by Norfolk County Council).

In addition to this, staff receive safeguarding updates throughout the year, refreshing their knowledge of various safeguarding matters.

At Hillcrest, Safeguarding is **EVERYONE'S** responsibility.









Hillcrest's bespoke Text Linked Curriculum (TLC) is very precious to us!

Our dedicated staff team has spent many, many hours creating and developing a **truly inspirational and bespoke curriculum with reading at its heart**.

To promote this love of reading, our curriculum bases each learning experience around key quality texts that are carefully chosen, with activities designed to make links between concepts, enabling learners to *maximise* and reach their potential.



At Hillcrest, we have our very own Thrive Practitioner and Mental Health First Aider, Mrs Perillo, who is based in our Unworry Room. Mrs Perillo meets with lots of different pupils to help them to thrive!

United Against Bullying

Hillcrest is dedicated to stamping out bullying in all forms. The school's Anti-Bullying Policy heavily involved the pupils in its creation. The school has signed up to the Anti-Bullying Alliance's United Against Bullying Initiative.

• Active Bystanders

Hillcrest has joined Norfolk County Council, in conjunction with the Crime Commissioner's Office, to deliver the Bystander Intervention Programme. The aim of the programme is to train and upskill children and young people to become active bystanders who can safely intervene to prevent incidents of sexual harassment. Schools and colleges throughout Norfolk have enrolled in the programme since its formation and the feedback from them is very positive.

• Help for LGBT Students & Families

Hillcrest is a community that values each and every individual. Pupils, staff and families who identify as LGBT+ are safe and valued here!

• Smart School Council

Each week, our School Council Representatives (democratically voted for at the beginning of each school year in Class Elections) lead their class through a meeting where a question has been posed to them.







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We value each and every one of our children as an individual right from the start of their journey at Hillcrest Primary School and our kind, caring staff ensure they have a smooth transition from preschool/ nursery, including visits to preschools and a home visit.

In EYFS we follow the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum. Our children are nurtured in a secure environment, whilst being allowed to explore, enquire and develop their learning both inside and outside the classroom.


The 7 areas of learning in the EYFS

who has a love for reading, uses new vocabulary to talk about what they have read or has been read to them, read words and simple sentences, using their phonics knowledge.

who is eager to take part in outdoor learning, shows curiosity about the world around them including the local area, whilst understanding similarities and differences through their exploration.

To become an:

Amazing Athlete

who can show strength balance and co-ordination when playing, move confidently and safely in a variety of different ways, using a range of equipment.

who can hold a pencil effectively, is a keen writer, can write letters that are formed correctly, write words and simple sentences that can be read by others and enjoy the writing process.

Master of Maths

who is passionate about numbers, has a deep understanding of numbers to 10, recognises patterns, subitise, compares quantities and recalls number bonds to 10 and beyond.

who can choose and safely use their resources they need to make their creations, talk about the processes and begin to plan and evaluate their creations verbally.

• Befriending the Elderly

Year 5 have the opportunity to visit a local care home to build some inter-generational links. The residents thoroughly enjoy reading with the children, playing games with them as well as telling stories of times gone by.

Supporting Charities

Hillcrest pupils often express a desire to help those less fortunate than themselves. Hillcrest gives to the Downham Market Foodbank each year through our Reverse Advent initiative. Recently, the school raised over £2,000 to offer support to those affected by the Syria-Turkey earthquake.

• Eco Council

Each year, children democratically elect representatives from their class to join the Hillcrest Eco Council, who champion environmental causes at the school.

School Council

In addition to the Eco Council, elections are held for School Council representatives from each class. The elected children run weekly meetings, where a question is posed to the entire school for the children to discuss and vote upon. They then upload their responses from our Deputy Headteacher to action!

• 5Cs Champions

A pupil from each class is nominated by their teacher to become the 5C Champion! This pupil encourages, praises and motivates their peers to embody the 5Cs just as they do! They proudly wear brightly coloured lanyard to advertise that they champion the 5Cs!

Hillcrest is very much part of our community. Pupils get involved in a variety of events and activities at Hillcrest; in Downham Market and beyond!

• IMP News Show

At Hillcrest, we have our very own pupil-run news show! A group of pupils wanted to deliver news that was Informative, Mind-blowing & Positive! They do a great job and make use of our custom built recording studio.

• The Hillcrest Choir

Our choir is renowned in the area for putting on professional and heart-felt performances. The choir perform annually at the Downham Christmas lights switch-on ceremony, as well as performing for residents at the various care homes in the town.

• Extra-curricular Clubs

Hillcrest has a very dedicated staff team. Many of them give up their time to run afterschool (or lunchtime) clubs for the children to enjoy. We also have some outside groups - like King's Lynn Town Football Club - run specialist clubs after school.

• Pupil-initiated Clubs

In addition to clubs started by adults, our pupils in Years 4, 5 & 6 are encouraged to create clubs that interest them; supervised by staff members, of course!
