### **Pro-Kick Charitable Fundraiser**

As of the time that this Newsletter was being compiled, Hillcrest families had raised £3938 with 60% of this sum going towards the great causes that the Sports Connections Foundation support. The other 40%, approximately £1600, will go to the Friends of Hillcrest to support their work around the school.

#### **Reverse Advent Calendar**

On Monday 20<sup>th</sup> November, we will be launching the annual Reverse Advent Calendar. Over the 4 weeks from that date, we will be asking the children and their families to bring various food and non-food items into school. These items will be donated to Downham's Foodbank in time for Christmas to ensure that those families most in need of this additional support can access it over the festive period and beyond.

During the Week beginning 20<sup>th</sup> November, we will be asking families to donate dried food items (such as pasta), whilst during Week 2 (w/b 27<sup>th</sup> November) the emphasis shifts to liquids (such as fizzy drinks). In Week 3 (w/b 4<sup>th</sup> December) we will be requesting tinned food items and then during the final week of the Reverse Advent Calendar (w/b 11<sup>th</sup> December) we will be looking at non-food items.

Further details will be released after half-term.

#### Panto Trip – FINAL REMINDER

The annual Pantomime trip to Hunstanton takes place on Monday 11<sup>th</sup> December for Years 1, 3 & 5 and on Wednesday 13<sup>th</sup> December for Years 2, 4 & 6.

The trip is being heavily subsidised by the Friends of Hillcrest who are covering the cost of the transport to Hunstanton, which comes to well over £2000. This means that the trip is cheaper than it was last year at £11.50 per child.

Bookings are now being taken via WisePay. If a significant number of parents in any one year group have not paid by Friday 17<sup>th</sup> November, the trip may be cancelled for those year groups.

#### **Colder Weather on the Way**

We have had a brief taste of the colder, windier weather this week that we may get more of after the half-term break.

A reminder to parents that the children will go out to play in all temperatures as it is usually the heavy rain that prevents the children from going out to break. Therefore, can the children please be reminded to come to school in a warm coat and, where appropriate, gloves and a hat. All such winter weather items should be clearly labelled so that we can reunite lost items of clothing with their owners.
