### Reverse Advent Calendar Gets Off to Great Start

A massive thank you to all those parents who have sent their children in with items for the Reverse Advent Calendar throughout the first week of our annual charitable giving event.

So far, the following items have been donated to us...

- 93 packets of dried pasta;
- 63 packets of gravy granules;
- 57 packets of dried fruit;
- 42 multipacks of crisps.

### Pro-Kick Charitable Fundraiser

A massive grand total of £4478 was raised by the children as part of the recent Pro-Kick fundraising event. This means that £1791 comes back into school via the Friends of Hillcrest who receive 40% of the money raised with the other 60% being used across the UK and internationally by the Sports Connections Foundation to help improve the lives of others through the medium of sport.

We apologise for the lengthy delay between the event taking place, the money being raised and the children getting their medals, wristbands and footballs. Hillcrest has been working hard with the Sports Connections Foundation to tie up payments with sponsorship forms so that the correct amount of each item can be sent out to the school. We were hoping to receive the gifts this week but, as yet, they haven't arrived. However, all children should have their relevant items by the end of next week.

## Children in Need

£353 was raised through our recent non-uniform day in aid of Children in Need. Thank you to all who took part.

## Timetabling During the Spring Term

From January, there will be a subtle change to the way the children are taught throughout the remainder of the year.

In order to address one of the main areas for improvement from the recent Ofsted inspection, we are looking to use the expertise demonstrated by various members of the teaching staff across the different Foundation Subjects to support children other than those in their own class.

The teaching of Modern Foreign Languages was raised as an area for improvement within the most recent Ofsted inspection report along with there being a similar mention for Music, even though the Music subject leadership team were praised in the same breath.

Therefore, from January all of the Key Stage 2 classes will spend a small part of the week being taught by another teacher. The main subjects that your child's class teacher will not teach are MFL, Music and PE with each of these subjects being taught by someone who is passionate and knowledgeable in that subject.

This IS NOT about Hillcrest moving to a more secondary style of timetabling from January. Indeed, most classes will find they are without their class teacher for around 4 lessons each week, some a little more. Instead, during those lessons they will be receiving an expert input from a French specialist, Music specialist or PE specialist. Some other subjects will also be taught by teachers other than your child's class teacher but MFL, Music and PE are the subjects being more widely taught by others.

Indeed, running alongside this new plan is a programme of Continued Professional Development for all of the teachers, focussing on the teaching of MFL and Music. The plan is to then remove the need for timetabling next September with the children returning to being taught the full range of subjects by their class teacher from that point.

We can confirm that your child will continue to spend the vast majority of their working week with their class teacher. Each teacher will continue to teach the core subjects of English, Maths and Science to their own class and will be feeding back, as normal, on these at the next parent's evening in February.

## World Record Attempt Postponed

We had let the children know in recent weeks about a planned World Record Attempt that was due to take place at Hillcrest. On 3<sup>rd</sup> December, we were expecting to be hosting an attempt to break the World Record for a live Nativity scene. However, due to complications and complexities of organising such an event, it is being postponed for this year.

We are going to try again next year to break the record. Watch this space!

## **Considerate Parking**

We have received a few messages recently from residents in Sandringham Drive and Hogarth Road regarding parents parking in front of their driveways when picking up and dropping off children.

We would like to remind parents that the new parking restrictions around the school were put into effect by the local authority following years of parking issues and debate locally and following the extension of the school building.

I am sure that both parents and residents alike would be keen to avoid further restrictions and also keen to avoid animosity.

If you pick your children up by car, please ensure that you are not blocking a resident's driveway. Thank you.

## **Colder Weather on the Way**

It looks as though we are entering a period of much colder weather this week.

A reminder to parents that the children will go out to play in all temperatures as it is usually the heavy rain that prevents them from going out to break. Therefore, can the children please be reminded to come to school in a warm coat and, where appropriate, gloves and a hat. All such winter weather items should be clearly labelled so that we can reunite lost items of clothing with their owners.

## **Christmas Dinner and Jumper Day**

The children are invited to come into school on Tuesday 19<sup>th</sup> December in non-school uniform for Christmas Dinner Day. However, in keeping with the spirit of the festive period, the children are encouraged to come to school dressed in the most outrageous and sparkly Christmas jumper.
